

# Summer Festival 2010

## 2 week Foundation Course

**Do you have an interest in the performing arts? Want to learn new theatre skills and meet like minded friends? Then Summer festival is for you!**

## About Summer Festival

Scottish Youth Theatre has been running theatre arts courses for over 33 years. Summer Festival (SF) offers selected participants the opportunity to spend time in the summer taking part in intensive professional training and performances. SF also offers a great opportunity to meet friends from around the country and around the world - many of whom you will keep in touch with long after Summer Festival is over.

## Foundation Course

If you are aged between 12 and 15, then you can apply for Scottish Youth Theatre's Two Week Foundation Course. This performance course offers the chance to work on general drama skills through a series of workshops and rehearsals. Participants work with professional directors and specialist skills tutors to devise, rehearse and perform a new and exciting piece of theatre.

For SF2010 we plan to run foundation courses in Aberdeen, Edinburgh and Glasgow (Glasgow will have a residential option).

The Foundation Course is hard work. There is a lot to get through in two weeks! If you are offered a place you will be expected to work from 10am to 6pm every day, Monday to Saturday.

When a residential option is available, the accommodation is Halls of Residence for a nearby University or College and Scottish Youth Theatre appoints residential staff to supervise the participants.

## The Application Process

### 1. Fill in the Application Form

An application will be included in this pack (you can get more from our website – [www.scottishyouththeatre.org](http://www.scottishyouththeatre.org) or by calling 0141 5523988).

Fill in the details about yourself, choose a course location, and decide the most convenient place for your audition. You must, however, where possible provide a second choice for each. On the back of the form please tell us as much as you can about yourself as you can and why you want to apply. You will also need:

- A cheque or postal order for £10 to cover the audition/administration fee.
- A passport sized photograph.
- The name of a referee.
- The signature of a parent or guardian.

## **2. Attend a workshop/interview.**

Everyone who applies for the Foundation Course is guaranteed an audition in the form of a workshop and interview. Further information about the workshop and interview will be sent to you with your audition date confirmation. Usually there will be two or three Scottish Youth Theatre staff present at the audition.

The first part of the audition will be a drama workshop session with other applicants. Don't worry if you have no experience of workshops – the session allows staff to observe how you interact with other participants.

The second part of the audition will consist of a short chat with the panel - this is your chance to ask any questions you may have about Scottish Youth Theatre or Summer Festival 2010 as well as telling them a bit about yourself. Remember, we are looking for people who will enjoy the Foundation Course as a learning experience.

We try to hold auditions in as many parts of the country as possible. If your school or group has more than eight applicants for SF2010 then we will try to arrange for the audition team to come out to you (ask your teacher or leader to contact us). We try our best to ensure that everyone who applies is allocated an audition as near to home as possible. In exceptional circumstances we may accept an audition by video, letter and/or telephone conversation.

Foundation Course auditions will take place in February and March 2010. As auditions are usually held between 9.30am - 6pm, time off school may be required. Attending the audition does not commit you to attending Summer Festival - if you are accepted you will receive a formal offer of a place.

## **3. The Outcome**

REMEMBER: Scottish Youth Theatre receives many more applications than there are places, so not everyone will be successful. You will hear from us either way by the end of April.

## **4. Fundraising**

Please do not let money matters stop you from applying. Fees can be paid in installments and Scottish Youth Theatre will provide advice on various trust funds and grants which may be available. Some local councils and education departments

also provide part funding. Many of our past participants have held fundraising events or sought sponsors through their local papers. Past participants have been able to raise at least half of the cost and some people manage to raise the entire amount!

## Money Matters

**FOUNDATION COURSE TUITION FEES:** For 2010 the course fee is £250. This works out at £20 per day.

**APPROX RESIDENCE COSTS (INCLUDING BREAKFAST & EVENING MEAL):** This will be determined by the service provider. In 2009 this was £450. This is approx £32 a day which includes bed, breakfast, an evening meal and Scottish Youth Theatre appoints trained residential staff to supervise participants.

On top of these fees you will require pocket money for lunches, snacks, entertainment etc.
